ADMISSIONS

The application deadline for Fall entrance is in early January of the same year. Application requirements include three essays, three professional letters of recommendation, current resume, college transcripts, TOEFL or IELTS scores, a programming proficiency form, and an application fee. Numerous programs — from fellowships and loans, to teaching and research appointments, subsidized housing, and child care — are available to help you finance the cost of graduate school. Additionally, all MIMS applicants will automatically be considered for applicable I School and California Promise Fellowship Package opportunities. Fellowship Packages range from \$5,000 to \$65,000 and are awarded to a limited number of admitted MIMS students.
