The Big Game, is a college football rivalry game played by the California Golden Bears of the University of California, Berkeley and Stanford Cardinal of Stanford University.



The 1920s saw the first golden age of California football, as the Golden Bears went 50 straight games without a defeat from 1920 to 1925. The 1920-1924 squads were so dominant that they were nicknamed **The**

California won 4 National Championships in this period.

Football suspended because of its violence

on March 19 th, 1892. Stanford won 14 - 10.



In 1924 Stanford hired former Cornell and Pittsburgh Head Coach, Glenn Scobey "Pop" Warner.

Two years after being hired, Pop Warner, led Stanford to their only **National Championship in 1926**. He stayed at Stanford for 9 years, playing in 3 Rose Bowls during that period.

The popular and national youth football program Pop Warner Little Scholars is named after him.





In his four seasons (1979–1982) at Stanford, John Elway completed 774 passes for 9,349 yards and 77 touchdowns. He graduated with nearly every Stanford and Pacific-10 career record for passing and total offense. Elway went on to win 2 Super Bowls with the Denver Broncos and an NFL MVP (1987).

He was inducted to the College and Pro Football Hall of Fame in 2007 and 2004 respectively.





Andrew Luck was the runner-up for the Heisman Trophy twice, in 2010 and 2011. Luck set a new Stanford record for career touchdown passes with 82, breaking John Elway's record of 77.

He was selected 1st overall in the 2012 NFL Draft.

n $2\overline{0}13$, **Stanford won 63** - **13**, setting the record for most points scored in a Big Game.



In 1947 Lynn "Pappy" Waldorf became the Head Coach. Known as Pappy's Boys, Cal teams of '47 to '50 won 33 consecutive regular season games earning 3 Rose Bowl berths. Cal lost all three Rose Bowls.

Pappy left in 1956 with a record of 67-32-4, and won all but one Big Games in that time.

In 2003 and 2004, Aaron Rodgers was the Quaterback of California. In his last season he led the team to a #4 ranking. After a controversial poll, Texas was selected over California for the Rose Bowl.

Rodgers went on to become NFL MVP and Super Bowl Champion with the Gren Bay Packers.
